Mission Statement

The mission of this program is to educate students in the care of orthopaedic patients, concentrating on the art of casting and splinting. Students will be specially trained to assist orthopaedic physicians in the care of patients with musculoskeletal injuries or conditions. Upon completion of this program candidates will be prepared to take the national exam administered by the National Board of Certified Orthopaedic Technologists (NBCOT).

Admissions Requirements

1. High school diploma or GED
2. Personal interview and essay
3. The applicant must complete a course in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation and Airway Obstruction Management for one and two person adult, infant, and child before program registration

Program Goals

1. To prepare students for entry level positions in orthopaedic technology according to the standards set by the National Board of Certification for Orthopaedic Technologists
2. To prepare students for the NBCOT certification exam
3. To prepare students to function in a professional orthopaedic environment
4. To graduate a minimum of 50% of students from the program within 1 year of admission to the program
5. To promote the value of lifelong learning and service to the community
